
AGM

Winston Business Centre Access Road.



For some while now the surface of this 'private' access road has been breaking up to the point where the metal reinforcing rods were exposed.



Viridor undertook this repair as a gesture of goodwill. On the 11th February the road was repaired as well as they could. Realistically the sub surface was never properly prepared and given the volume of traffic that the access road carries it will possibly result in a failure of the surface again sometime in the future.

Marlborough Road Progress

Work commenced on this project to repair the damaged drain on Monday 14th March. Progress has been swift and the contractor is hopeful that the road will reopen on Monday 28th March just 2 weeks repair time.



WSSC Local Area Committee Meeting 10th March

Lancing Business Park were represented at this meeting where the proposed parking restrictions for Lancing Business Park were discussed the committee approved the proposal with only one minor amendment, however, the point was made that it was futile to paint the new yellow lines until the road surface situation has been resolved. *(Footnote: Lancing Business Park have already started putting pressure on WSSC Highways to get them to commit to a full resurfacing exercise on the highways within Lancing Business Park)*
